BOOSTER ORGANIZATIONS</p> <p>The Board recognizes booster organizations as being formed for the purpose of assisting and supporting extracurricular activities in the schools.</p> <p>The activities of <b>booster</b> organizations will be reviewed by the administration and reported to the Board to ensure that the activities promote student interests primarily, rather than the special interests of any particular group.</p> <p>The building principal or his/her designee (not the coach or advisor) will attend all booster organization meetings and will be the liaison between the booster group and the Board.</p> <p>Each booster <b>organization</b> will present, in writing, to the building principal a plan for all projects and activities. The building principal will evaluate such plans and make a report to the Superintendent, who will in turn report to the Board. No project will be initiated without the review of the building principal, <b>and will be subject to the Board's right to reject any proposed project.</b></p> <p>The recommendation for each plan submitted will be made on the basis of educational value to the total school program, benefit to <b>students</b>, and compliance with community standards.</p> <p>Fundraising activities will be governed by the same rules and regulations that govern all other school-related fundraising drives.</p> <p>District facilities will be used in accordance with the guidelines established in <b>Board</b> policy.</p> <p>Decisions, such as selection of student participants, coaches and/or advisors, and scheduling, that affect the operation of the group which the booster organization supports will be determined by the school administration and <b>applicable</b> policies adopted by the Board.</p> <p>The Board retains final authority over all phases of the educational program, including the help of any booster organizations.</p>
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
