Jacket Pride Initiative

Over the last year, a wave has been building to revitalize the Ferndale Area School District and catapult us into the high performing school district we know we can be. The wave reached a crest in the spring of 2010, with the formal roll out of what has been dubbed our Jacket Pride Initiative. Students, teachers, administrators, parents, and board members have joined forces to work toward this goal of instilling



pride and motivation by expanding our programs, increasing student opportunities, and maximizing student readiness for life after high school.

The kick-off to this initiative came May 19 with a meeting of key stakeholders on a Guiding Committee, including students, teachers, administrators, parents, and board members. Dr. Patrick Crawford, Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Leadership Development Center, is facilitating the process, along with other associates who are leaders in the field, like Dr. Jay Scott, and Dr. Chuck Kensinger. After the initial meeting, a data gathering phase began. Constituent groups met with the facilitators to come up with a list of district strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. This has been a daunting task, and we are still in the process of gathering input from parents and

community members---see the note at the end of the article if you want to participate in the data gathering phase. The Guiding Committee met again June 21 to review data gathered to date, and to revisit the district mission statement, develop universal values and belief statements and brand the initiative. Results of the data collection as well as values and belief statements will be published in the fall newsletter. Please stayed tuned.....this is HUGE! Future meetings will be scheduled to continue to develop action plans and to look at other areas that tie into effectiveness such as communication, public relations, school climate, and continued data collection to measure progress. The Jacket Pride Initiative will be determined and rolled out over the course of a year, with continued analysis and implementation for years to come. Follow the progress as we move ever closer to that "private school in a public school setting" reality and become noted as a High Performing School District in Pennsylvania.



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District Adopts 2010-2011 Budget

The Ferndale Area School Board adopted the 2010-2011 fiscal year budget on June 16, 2010. Real estate millage was set at 65.83 mills, which was an increase of 2.83 mills. After review, the Pennsylvania Department of Education approved the tax rate. The increase was less than the 2010-2011 index of 4.5% which was required by Act 1 participating districts.

Not only are the students here at Ferndale Area Elementary learning academics, they are also learning the importance of giving back to the community. Third grade collected cold-weather necessities, such as hats, gloves and scarves to assemble a "mitten tree." Over 100 pieces of cold-weather necessities were donated to New Day, Inc.

Fourth grade was really busy this year. At Christmas time, they collected items to be donated to our local Humane Society. They gathered up newspapers, food, paper towels, bleach, and other items. It made the kids feel real good

helping our furry friends. Around Valentine's Day, they organized a school wide penny drive called "Pennies for Love" to benefit Lafora Research. In a one week time frame, the students raised \$1,356.25. GREAT JOB!

All participants in the camp received a T-shirt, and the proceeds of the camp went to the Epilepsy Awareness Foundation. The camp raised \$200 for the Epilepsy Foundation.

Shardawn Lantzy and Brittany Eisenhuth held a powder puff football game in May. This idea came from working on their senior projects. "We had the alumni come back, and teachers helped us raise over \$1,000 in profit to help Jess," Shardawn said. "It turned out to be more than just a powder puff football game," Brittany
